Quality-of-life milestones boost Worthington's 'go to' value

Community partners celebrate, plan

Business owners who are evaluating reasons for locating or retaining their companies in Worthington can chalk up three more reasons for “choosing Worthington for business” this month. Adding to amenities that make Worthington an attractive place to work, live, play and grow a business, our community now boasts Ohio’s newest cultural facility, a school district with an A-plus state rating, and the launch of a “community visioning” process that is a partnership effort of the city, schools and library system in planning for the future of Worthington.

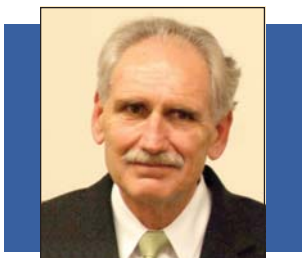
Arts enthusiasts and others are celebrating the long-awaited opening of the Peggy R. McConnell Arts Center (MAC) at 160 W. Dublin Granville Road, adjacent to Thomas Worthington High School. The contemporary, multidisciplinary facility will present and promote performing, visual and digital arts in a 20,000-square-foot building with a 213-seat theatre, an exhibition gallery, five classrooms, a dance studio and rotating exhibitions sprinkled throughout the facility. Opening activities included a ribbon-cutting ceremony and community celebration on Sunday, Nov. 8.

As the MAC’s doors were opening to its first events in late October, Worthington Schools celebrated several awards and recognitions for exemplary performance.

The State Board of Education awarded Worthington Schools its highest rating, “Excellent with Distinction.” “With Distinction” recognizes that the district exceeded expected gains for two consecutive years. Worthington Schools met 29 of 30 indicators, based on test results from third through

Community partners celebrate, plan for future

eighth graders and attendance and graduation rates for high school students.

School board members and guests celebrated the accomplishment at their Oct. 26 board meeting. A representative of the State Board of Education brought a banner commemorating the School board president, and David Bressman (Bressman Law Offices), school board president, treated the board and guests to an "A-plus" cake to celebrate the occasion. At the same meeting, the district's financial department was presented with the state's Award of Outstanding Achievement in Popular Annual Financial Reporting, and three Worthington students were recognized for receiving Outstanding Writing Awards from the National Council on Teachers of English. Nationally, there were 544 winners, among them, 18 from Ohio.

On Nov. 8, voters passed Issue 49, an incremental three-year operating levy, with a 60/40 margin. Without the additional funding generated by the levy, the district faced cuts in personnel, transportation and support for extracurricular activities, sports and after-school programs for the 2010-11 school year.

The school district will have several partners in its planning for future needs. The City of Worthington, Worthington Schools and Worthington Libraries have launched a collaborative long-range strategic planning effort that will solicit public input and culminate in a community visioning conference on Jan. 21 and Jan. 22. The joint planning project, known as Worthington Area 360, is facilitated with the help of Communica, a Chamber-member marketing firm, and Management Partners, a national consulting firm. The



consultants have conducted focus groups and telephone surveys to begin the community input stage.

The process is guided by a steering committee of community members, including several Chamber member business leaders and Chamber executive director Kathryn Paugh. Following the Visioning Conference, city, school and library strategic plans will be released in Spring 2010. The Chamber will delay its annual strategic planning, typically done in February, until spring to allow the Chamber board to study the other plans and consider complementary and supportive initiatives. ★
